MISSION STATEMENT UPDATE – Jairo

On July 31st several members of the committee met in Concord to revise the Committee's Mission Statement. The group was divided into 4 smaller groups. Each small group produced a proposed Mission Statement. After 3 hours of group discussions the following proposals were submitted by the 4 groups:

"To inspire services and support that encourages full inclusion and honors the diversity of our community"

"To innovatively create equity, diversity and respect for minority and underserved rceb consumers and their families"

"To create equitable support systems through approaches that are radical openness and cultural humility in our community"

"The rceb diversity and equity committee works to allocate resources, provide tools, and partner with individuals and families to increase representation and reduce service disparity across ethnicity, language and culture".

The next step was for Jairo to consolidate the 4 proposals into one Mission Statement and submit by email to the group for suggestions or comments. After one suggestion from Sheraden Nicholau the new proposed Mission Statement reads:

"To build and promote equitable support systems for ethnically, culturally, and linguistically

Morena will submit this proposal to the Board for approval

NEW SERVICES UPDATES

Sandra Coss

Latino Parents in the self-determination program need to form a support group because the process is very difficult.

Sheraden and Sandra are making efforts to diversify the independent facilitators.

A Facebook page was created to share resources for families enrolled in the program.

A newsletter was also created to inform about orientations.

A new support group was created in Oakley in collaboration with the school district.

In Concord, some work has been done on a one-on-one basis with families dealing with personal issues.

A Posada (Christmas Celebration) has been scheduled for December 7th.

Her group will conduct an orientation for families.

Translate documents for an RCEB workshop on Living Options.

Held Moon festival outreach. One hundred ten people participated. A video produced by Helping Hands East bay was presented. The video introduces a range of services from RCEB. Consumers using the services are featured in the video. Esther will send the link to the video for everyone to see.

Self Determination will start in 2 years. This committee should pay attention to this fact due to the new services that will be developed to satisfy the needs of consumers/families.

350 people signed in for seminars on self-determination.

Four individuals were certified in Person Centered Planning. Certified individuals speak the following languages: Spanish, Tagalog, Cantonese, and Mandarin. Lisa clarified that there's no certification for Person Center Planning.

More seminars are planned in the near future.

Sheraden stated that some pre-requisites will be developed for Person Centered Planning facilitators. The focus is to make it easy for people to complete the 8 hours training.

Sister Marygrace Puchac

We started hiring Mien and Cambodian staff. Today we are hiring Chinese and Vietnamese staff to serve those communities. Each new staff enriches our work.
