## Presentation #1 - Sheraden Nicholau: Overview on Ableism and Resources

- State Council office offers training to a variety of organizations on elements of systemic change, capacity building, and advocacy
- Ableism is a term similar to that of racism and sexism. Catches attitudinal barriers and calls out the institutional nature of ableist societies.
- Identity-first versus people-first language
- Plain language documents to ensure ease of access
- Tokenism

## Presentation #2 – Michael Pereira: DDS Rate Study and Commentary

- Review of the initial documents (2100 pages plus several appendices) presented to the community the week of February 25<sup>th</sup>, 2019
- DDS and Burns & Associates have not presented a narrative nor a fiscal impact to the legislature
- Only 60 out of 150 service codes reviewed in the study. Tailored Day Services and Childcare not included as an example of what was missed
- Geographic differentials for transportation, real estate, and wages taken into account, as well as wage compression and spillover

- Vendors encouraged to review the documents and test how the proposed changes would affect their individual programs
- Vendor advisory committee (VAC) chairs asked to collect responses and submit to DDS by April 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019
- Our PVAC will convene a workgroup on March 15<sup>th</sup> in the RCEB conference room A from 9am to 12 pm to gather general commentary
